From Pastor Rob

I love the Autumn season; and everything about it! Please bare in mind that I am writing this from the perspective of one who was born and raised in Georgia, went to graduate school in Kentucky and then served the United Methodist Church for fifteen years in Mississippi. I am fully aware that "Fall" in Texas is sporadic and unpredictable. Nevertheless, I speak from a place of nostalgia. Fall! The slight chill in the air to let us know that winter is coming. The smell of fires burning to offer light and warmth to friendly hearths. The start of the holiday season! And let us not forget the explosion of color which the fall affords. It is amazing to see such beauty. Psalm twenty-four verses one and two remind us:

"1 The earth is the Lord's and all that is in it, the world, and those who live in it; 2 for He has founded it on the seas, and established it on the rivers."

God is truly an artist! Everything that exists was created by His will through His word! How is it that folks can witness the beauty of creation and still deny the existence of the creator? The writer of Psalm fourteen wondered the same thing. Verse one of that psalm says this:

"Fools say in their hearts, 'There is no God.""

We need to pray for those folks who are walking through life as fools. Sometimes they do this out of stubbornness. But much of the time people remain fools because of ignorance. Those of us who are Christians have to remember that it is our mission, given to us by the Lord Jesus Christ Himself, to spread the news of the gospel throughout the world. We are all called to be missionaries. Don't let that idea frighten you. Not all of us are called to go to China or Uzbekistan or Zimbabwe or even inner-city Chicago! Many of us are called to minister where we are. But make no mistake about it. If you are a Christian, then you are called. You have a mission.

Fall is a wonderful time to talk about the majesty and wonder of God. God's plan is so perfect, that even in death there is beauty. We sometimes forget that those leaves which offer such splendid colors, are, in fact, dead. If it weren't for the cycle of life that God created and put into motion, we would not have wonderful colors.

God took another situation of death and made something beautiful out of it. Crucifixion is not pretty! It is a horrible, painful way to die! In fact, our word "excruciating" which means "great, unendurable pain" comes from a Latin word for crucify. "Crucifixion" and "excruciating" come from the same source. Crucifixion was not beautiful; but God used it to cause beauty. Jesus had to take the sins of the world upon Himself. He bore them to the cross and He left them there! The result of this agonizing death was the most beautiful thing in the world, salvation. Salvation is beautiful! Jesus had to die to bring about that beauty!

This fall season as you are preparing for the holidays and enjoying the splendor of creation. Allow the beautiful sights around you to remind you of Jesus nailed to that cross bearing our sins unto death. Don't be foolish! Remember that there is a God. God loves you and wants you to enjoy the beautiful things in life. The world that He created and the salvation which He freely offers to everyone. And do not let those around you be fools either. Share the love of Christ with all who will listen. Shalom!
